VOCABULARY

- **acceptable** /ək'septəbəl/ (adj) : còu theá chaáp nhaän ñöôic

- accept /ək'sept/ (v): chaáp nhaän

- acceptance /ək'septəns/ (n): söi chaáp nhaän

- **approach** /ə'prəʊtʃ/ (v): ñéán gaän

Ví duï: *The weather was getting colder as winter was approaching.*

- **appropriate** /ə'prəʊpri-ət/ (adj): thích hôip

Ví duï: *The book was written in a style appropriate to the age of the children.*

- **assistance** /ə'sistəns/ (n) : söi giuúp ñôõ

Ví duï: *People in the flooded areas are in need of direct assistance.*

- assist /ə'sist/ (v) : giuúp ñôõ (= to help)

- assistant /ə'sistənt/ (n): ngöôøi trôï lỳ; ngöôøi baùn haøng

- **attention** /ə'tenʃən/ (n) : söi chuù yù

- pay attention to (v) : chuù yù ñéán

- **brief** /bri:f/ (adj) : ngaén goïn, nhanh

- **clap one's hands** /klæp/ (v) : voã tay

- **communication** /kə,mju:nɪ'keɪʃən/ (n): söi giao tieáp; söi truyeàn thoàng

- **informality** /,ɪnfə:'mæləti/ (n): söi thaân maät

Ví duï: *The informality made the atmosphere of the meeting less stressful.*

- informal /ɪn'fɔ:məl/ (adj) : thaân maät, khoáng theo nghi thöüc

- formal /'fɔ:məl/ (adj) : trang troïng, chính thöüc

- formality /fɔ:'mæləti/ (n) : söi trang troïng; thuû tuïc

- **instance** /'ɪnstəns/ (n) : tröôøng hôip; ví duï

Ví duï: *In this instance it is important to check that the machine is working properly before you use it.*

- for instance : ví duï nhö (= for example)

- **non-verbal** /,nɒn'vɜ:bəl/ (adj): khoáng duøng lôøi noùi

- verbal /'vɜ:bəl/ (adj): duøng lôøi noùi; thuoác veà ngoân töø

- **signal** /'sɪgnəl/ (n) : tín hieäu; (v) ra hieäu

- **situation** /,sɪtʃu'eɪʃən/ (n) : tình huoáng, hoaøn caûnh

- **slightly** /'slaitli/ (adv) : nheï nhaøng

Ví duï: *My arms were aching so I had to shift my position slightly.*

- **socialise (with)** /'səʊʃəl-aɪz/ (v): xäo giao vöü; hoøa ñoàng vöü

Ví duï: *I enjoy socializing with the other students.*
