

The book "The scarlet letter" written by writer Nathaniel Hawthorne is typical of the American psychological novel of the 19th century. This is one of the grimmest stories of women's fate I have ever known. I read the book in bewilderment, pain, hatred, and complete helplessness. Young woman Hester Prynne was found guilty and sentenced to wear a red A on her chest for being "pregnant unmarried." The letter A stands for "Adulteru," which means adultery. In those days, adultery was the greatest crime against women. Any woman wearing a red A-shirt will face a maximum sentence of death. But in this story, Hester bravely fought not to accept death, but then the price she had to pay was contempt, turning away a whole community of people towards her.

I felt the extreme pain of that woman when I had to live alone with evil, curious eyes that seemed to pierce my heart. But I can't help but admire her because she can live every moment to the fullest to give the crystallization of her true love and the man she loves a chance to live. I attentively follow her every step on the journey that she is on. I didn't take my eyes off her and those around her even for a moment. And I have realized that the eyes of the people next to her when looking at her have gradually changed. I no longer felt the suffocating hatred and anger in my eyes. Instead, I met a gaze of love, forgiveness, and empathy. Indeed, her pure life, love, and sacrifice prevented the community from turning their backs on her. She lived a simple, calm life like so many other women. People no longer blame her. Naturally, you deserve it with what you've been through. Her kind heart has made the red letter A on her body a fading trace of the distant past. Still, now, when looking at the girl who used to have a reputation for adultery and pregnancy, people only feel compassion and selflessness for the plight of the women of this society.



### Đặng Thị Thùy Trang 10A8

The Dublin is the first short story of James Joyce, one of the greatest and most influential writers of the 20th century.

The Dublin people probably come from the story "The Dead": Being a teacher and a book collaborator, Gabriel has an arrogant intellectual look and only pays attention to themselves, but it is at a messy party, through Gabriel's contact and collision, the most pride of Gabriel gradually collapsed and the highest peak was at the end of the party when watching his wife - Gabriel Conroy, Gretta, listening to a piece of music, and finally knew the past of his wife. She told him about a boyfriend from her youth, and he had a spiritual manifestation of life and death and the relationship between people.

A nationalist criticized the thought that he was an intellectual. He was only worried about the cliché speech, the belief that he was noticed and wholeheartedly, and then knew that Gretta had another love affair. And the young man who died for her, Gabriel, realized that Gretta's life had hidden corners he had never known.


He is aware of himself as "dumb" and understands the meaning of life, where the dead reign in memory as important as the living, where people must know how to accept life and death. So the first time he thought about going to the west, he went to find out about his nation, not summer vacation in Europe.

Those moments of "revelation" have different effects on the conclusions: when making the sourness increases multiplied, because the characters from which they are aware of how they have lived in the dark, but they are not able to go beyond their lives, sometimes make people turn good, seeking to change, even negligible, the life full of desperation right now.

By writing and publishing the Dublin people, Joyce showed a great position as a moral writer: Joyce told the darkness in his national social life, denouncing the ideology of the colonialists. He and religion covered the Ireland colony, criticizing the weakness of individuals who did not dare to rise—at the same time, he expressed symbolic sympathy with the fate of the miserable people—trapped in life's difficulties.




